This workshop is aimed at PhD researchers in the field of heritage and/ or landscape studies who have performed a part of their research and are looking for ways to publish on their ongoing research. It offers a very first introduction to paper-writing for academic journals and helps you get started on the process.

You are expected to bring in a 200-word abstract of your paper idea and the name of a potential journal in mind. At the end you will have a peer-reviewed version of your abstract and an introduction ready. But most importantly: you know how to work towards getting your first paper published.

Sessions, topics and preparatory tasks

September 15, 13:00-15:00

- preparation: students write a 200-word abstract of a potential paper
- Introduction to the masterclass, moderator: Linde Egberts
- Introduction to paper writing and peer-review process by Ana Pereira Roders
- example journal: Journal of European Landscapes by Hans Renes
- Peer-review of abstract for a specific journal of choice

October 6, 9:00-11:00

- preparation: students write a draft Introduction to their potential paper along the guidelines of the journal of choice.
- Introduction to the second day, moderator: Hans Renes
- peer review of introductions based on the review format that our journals use for the review process, led by Hans Renes and Linde Egberts
- making a writing plan for the rest of the paper

For those who are interested in publishing with Journal of European Landscapes, there is the opportunity to have another meeting on draft versions of papers in December with an editor.
